Athanasia crithmifolia
samphire-leaf athanasia (E)
klaaslouwbossie (A)



A rounded, compact bush with with small, silvery-green, needle-like leaves. With bright yellow flower heads in spring, at attracts small insects.



Leucadendron salignum
Common sunshine conebush (E)
Geelbos (A)



The brightly coloured leaves surround the cone-like flowers, advertising their pollen to insects.



Pelargonium capitatum
Coast pelargonium (E)
Kusmalva (A)



A low-growing, sprawling groundcover with soft, velvet-like, lobed leaves. Its scent makes it useful in perfumery and aromatherapy oils. Flowers attract various insects.

Zantedeschia aethiopica
Common arum lilly (E)
Wit varkoor (A)
Intebe (X)



A wetland plant with large white spathes and glossy green leaves. The faint scent attracts pollinating insects to the flowers inside.



Thamnochortus spicigerus
Large thatching reed (E)
Duineriet (A)



Highly drought-tolerant and plays a key role in soil stabilisation in sandy areas. The dry stems were traditionally used for brooms, thatch, and weaving baskets.



Leonotis leonurus
Wild dagga (E)
Wildedagga (A)
Umunyamunya (X)



A distinctive shrub with whorls of fuzzy, bright orange flowers stacked along the stems. It is traditionally used as medicine. The nectar attracts sunbirds.
