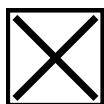

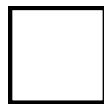
Eriocephalus africanus Wildrosemary (E), Kapokbos(A)



A strongly aromatic grey shrub with fluffy white seed heads. Birds use their fluffy, cottony seeds to line their nests.



Leonotis leonurus Lion's Ear (E), Umfinafincane (X), Duiwelstabak (A)



A shrubby plant with whorls of orange flowers is used as a traditional remedy and attracts nectar-feeding birds, especially sunbirds.



Thamnochortus spicigerus Dune Thatchreed (E), Dekriet (A)

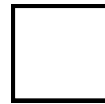


This robust restio with upright reed-like stems and brown flowering bracts was traditionally harvested for thatching. The family 'Restionaceae' comes from the Latin word, restis, meaning 'a rope', which the plant can be used for.

Osteospermum incanum Greybietou (E)

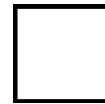


A low-growing shrub with silvery-grey foliage and bright yellow daisy-like flowers.



Drought-tolerant and ideal for colour contrast in gardens.

Pelargonium cucullatum Hooded-leaf pelargonium (E), wildemalva (A), ikhubalo (X) ,

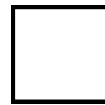


Recognised by its large, showy flowers and cupped leaves.



Traditionally used to treat coughs and skin conditions.

Pelargonium capitatum Rose-scented pelargonium (E), ikhubalo(X), Kusmalva (A)



This soft-leaved shrub has sweetly rose-scented leaves and pink flowers. Valued in perfumery and traditional medicine for treating wounds and respiratory infections.
